6	SECTION I. PURPOSE			
7				
8	The purpose of this Statute is to establishes a public Odawa Historic and Cultural Site Regist	try		
9	where property sites are identified, designated and cataloged as historical and cultural sites			
10	while increasing and broadening the public's understanding and appreciation of cultural and			
11	historic places; and to establish a non-pubic Odawa Historic and Cultural Site Registry that			
12	helps preserve significant historic and cultural places for future generations.

15	SECTION II. DEFINITIONS			
16				
17	A. "LTBB" or "Tribe" means the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians.			
18				
19	B. "Reservation" means all lands within the boundaries of the reservations for the Little			
20	Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians as set out in Article I, paragraphs third and fourth of th			
21	Treaty of 1855, 11 Stat. 621, plus any lands set out in Articles Second and Third of the Treaty			
22	March 28, 1836, 7 Stat. 491, in the event that the 1836 reservation is determined to include lands			
23	which are not included within the 1855 reservation, plus any lands outside of those boundaries			
24	which are now or in the future declared to be Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians			
25	reservation by the U.S. Department of the Interior.			
26				
27	C. "Tribal Citizen" means an enrolled member of the Little Traverse Bay Bands of			
28	Odawa Indians.

30	D. "Tribal Council" or "Council" means the elected body of the Little Traverse Bay			
31	Bands of Odawa Indians to carry out legislative powers under Article VII of the			
32 33	Constitution.

2	the Tribe or its Tribal Citizens for gathering of medicines, conducting ceremonies or other tribal

6	F.	"Tribal Historic Properties" means any prehistoric or historic sites, districts, structure	s,

10	G.	"Tribal Sacred Site" means any specific, discrete, narrowly delineated location that is				
11	identi	ed as sacred by virtue of its established religious significance or ceremonial use.

13	H.	"THPO" or "Office" means the Tribal Historic Preservation Office composed of				
14	the Tr	bal Historic Preservation Officer and staff.

5	site, a physical description of the place, and information about its historical, spiritual or cultural				
6	significance, that may	y be documented by oral histories or stories, a bibliography, photographs, or			
7	other means as appropriate.

9	SECTION VII.	NOTICE OF APPROVAL OR DECLINATION			
10					
11	The THPO shall noti	fy the person who has submitted a nomination for inclusion of a site into			
12	either of the Odawa Historic and Cultural Site Registries of the approval or denial within a				
13	reasonable time period after the submission of the nomination.

16	SECTION VIII.	RECONSIDERATION PROCESS			
17					
18	Any person who has	submitted a nomination to the THPO for inclusion of a site into either of the			
19	Odawa Historic and Cultural Site Registries and was denied may ask for reconsideration based				
20	on additional or new evidence that support the nomination. The THPO shall have approved				
21	policy and procedures that include the appeals process and time-frames.

24	SECTION IX.	NOTIFICATION TO OWNER OF PROPERTY			
25					
26	Upon approval of the	THPO of inclusion into public Odawa Historic and Cultural Site Registry,			
27	the THPO shall notify the owner and/or the person in control of the site of the Registry				
28	designation.

31	SECTION X.	PRIVATE PROPERTY			
32					

1	Private property listed in the Odawa Historic and Cultural Site Registry does not place any
2	restrictions or requirements on a private property owner. The private landowner is not required
3	to maintain the property in any specific way.
4	
5	
6	SECTION XI. SEVERABILITY
7	
8	If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, phrase or portion of this Statute is, for any
9	reason, held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall
10	be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the
11	validity of the remaining portions thereof.
12	
13	
14	SECTION XII. EFFECTIVE DATE
15	
16	Effective upon signature of the Executive or 30 days from Tribal Council approval whichever
17	comes first or if the Executive vetoes the legislation, then upon Tribal Council override of the
18	veto.

21	SECTION XIII. OTHER RELATED STATUTES
