TRIBAL RESOLUTION 022522-01

Use of American Rescue Plan Act ("ARP"), Restricted for Affordable Housing Development Funds, in the Amount of Four Million Dollars (\$4,000,000) for the Development of Multi-Unit Housing at Indian Town (Second Street), Harbor Springs, Michigan.

- WHEREAS the Waganakising Odawak Nation, known as the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians, and its citizens are vested with inherent sovereignty and right to self-governance;
- WHEREAS the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians (LTBB) is a federally recognized Indian Tribe under Public Law 103-324, and is a party to numerous Treaties with the United States the most recent of which being the Treaty of Washington of March 28, 1836 (7 Stat. 491) and the Treaty of Detroit of 1855 (11 Stat. 621);
- WHEREAS the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians are governed by a Tribal Constitution adopted by the citizens of the Tribe on February 1, 2005;
- WHEREAS on March 16, 2020, the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians declared a Tribal State of Emergency in order to promote the special care of health, education, and economic interests of all the people and especially our children and elders;

- WHEREAS, Tribal Council approved Certified Motion #102121-08, To restrict a Portion of the American Rescue Plan Act ("ARP") Funds for Affordable Housing Development in the amount of five million dollars (\$5,000,000).
- WHEREAS, the Tribe wishes to use four million dollars (\$4,000,000) for the development of multiunit housing located at Indian Town (Second Street), Harbor Springs, MI.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council authorizes and approves the use of ARPA funds that are restricted for Affordable Housing Development in the amount of four million dollars (\$4,000,000) for the development of multi-unit housing, located at Indian town (Second Street), Harbor Springs, MI, to prevent housing insecurity.

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED that in accordance with the Constitution the Executive Branch shall administer such funds as appropriated by Tribal Council.
