## TRIBAL RESOLUTION # 022522- ○ d

Supplemental Funding in the Amount of \$60,000.00 to the Department of Human Services for the Purpose of Providing Child Welfare Services

- WHEREAS the Waganakising Odawak Nation, known as the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians, and its citizens are vested with inherent sovereignty and right to self-governance;
- WHEREAS the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians (LTBB) is a federally recognized Indian Tribe under Public Law 103-324, and is a party to numerous Treaties with the United States the most recent of which being the Treaty of Washington of March 28, 1836 (7 Stat. 491) and the Treaty of Detroit of 1855 (11 Stat. 621);
- WHEREAS the LTBB Constitution states the Directive Principle: "Promote with special care the health, educational, and economic interests of all the people, especially our children and elders [...]"
- **WHEREAS** the LTBB Constitution further states, "Assure and promote that children are given opportunities and facilities to develop in a healthy manner, and in conditions of freedom and dignity [...];
- **WHEREAS** the Department of Human Services has a limited budget for providing child welfare services, and requires additional funding to provide child welfare services for case #JWC065-0217;

**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Tribal Council authorizes and approves funding to the Executive Branch, Department of Human Services, in the amount of sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000.00) with funding to come from the General Fund-Supplemental Funding, and these funds are restricted for the sole purpose of providing child welfare services for case #JWC-065-0217.



**FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED** that in accordance with the Constitution the Executive Branch shall administer such funds as appropriated by Tribal Council.
