9	The purpose of this Statute is to establish the compensation levels for Judges and Justices in		
10	accordance with the Tribal Constitution and based on Constitutional duties. This Statute repeals		
11	and replaces Waganakising Odawak Statute 2010-016 Constitutionally Mandated Compensation		
12	for Judges and Justices, Waganakising Odawak Statute 2008-014 Constitutionally Mandated		
13	Compensation Statute, Waganakising Odawak Statute 2003-05 Tribal Council Compensation,		
14	and WOS 2005-04 Constitutionally Mandated Compensation and any previous Statute,		
15	Resolution or Policy language with regard to compensation levels for such positions as stated in		
16	this purpose.

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## SECTION III. COMPENSATION CHANGE RESTRICTIONS

Any statute or statutory amendment changing the level of compensation for Judges and Justices shall not decrease the amount of compensation during the individual appointed terms.

## SECTION IV. COMPENSATION ESTABLISHED FOR JUDGES

A. In accordance with Article IX (G) of the Tribal Constitution, Compensation of the Chief Judge is herein established. To fulfill the responsibilities of the Chief Judge as stated in the Tribal Constitution and any relevant Statute, the Chief Judge shall be compensated and paid an annual salary.

1. The salary of the Chief Judge shall be negotiated by Tribal Council in consultation with LTBB Human Resources Department utilizing the 2019 Compensation & Classification as adopted for Tribal Governmental Employees following the table below:

B. In accordance with Article IX (G) of the Tribal Constitution, Compensation of the Associate Judge(s) is herein established. To fulfil the responsibilities of the Associate Judge as stated in the Tribal Constitution and any relevant Statute, the Associate Judge shall be compensated and paid an annual salary.

1. The salary of the Associate Judge(s) shall be negotiated by Tribal Council in consultation with the LTBB Human Resources Department and utilizing the 2019 Compensation & Classification as adopted for Tribal Governmental Employees following the table below:
