4	CONSTITUTIONALLY MANDATED COMPENSATION - TRIBAL COUNCIL			
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7	SECTION I. PURPOSE			
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9	The purpose of this Statute is to establish the compensation levels for the Tribal Council in			
10	accordance with the Tribal Constitution and based on Constitutional duties. This Statute repeals			
11	and replaces: Waganakising Odawak Statute 2010-017 Constitutionally Mandated Compensation			
12	for Tribal Council Member; Waganakising Odawak Statute 2008-014 Constitutionally Mandated			
13	Compensation Statute; Waganakising Odawak Statute 2003-05 Tribal Council Compensation;			
14	and WOS 2005-04 Constitutionally Mandated Compensation and any previous Statute,			
15	Resolution or Policy language with regard to compensation levels for such positions as stated in			
16	this purpose.			
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19	SECTION II. DEFINITIONS			
20				
21	A. "Annual Salary" means the amount of annual compensation paid to the individual during			
22	the calendar year for performing the function of a Tribal Council Officer or Tribal Councilor and			
23	for carrying out the duties of the Tribal Council Officer or Tribal Councilor as stated in the			
24	Tribal Constitution and any relevant Statute and paid in equal increments.			
25				
26	B. "Compensation" means the annual salary paid in equal increments and any benefits			
27	allowed by this Statute.			
28				
29	C. "Regularly Scheduled Tribal Council Meeting" means the Tribal Council Meetings that			
30 31	are set on an annual basis and published.			
32	D. "Tribal Council Officers" means the three (3) Tribal Council Officers defined in			
33	Articles VII (B) and VII (C) of the Tribal Constitution and consisting of the Legislative Leader,			
34 35	the Secretary, and the Treasurer.			

1	E. "Non-Officer Tribal Councilors" means the six (6) Tribal Councilors not defined in			
2 3	Articles VII (B) or VII (C) of the Tribal Constitution			
4	F. "Tribal Constitution" means the LTBB Constitution adopted by the Tribal Membership			
5	February 1, 2005.			
6				
7	G. "Tribe" shall mean the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians.

10	SECTION III. COMPENSATION CHANGE RESTRICTIONS			
11				
12	A. In accordance with Article VII (F) of the Tribal Constitution, any increase or decrease in			
13	the compensation established in this Statute shall take effect upon the oath of office following			
14	the next general election.			
15				
16	B. Any statute or statutory amendment increasing or decreasing the compensation of Tribal			
17	Councilors must be enacted before the Election Board distributes candidate petitions for the next			
18	general election.

2021	SECTION IV. COMPENSATION ESTABLISHED			
22	SECTION IV. COMPENSATION ESTABLISHED			
23	A. In accordance with Article VII (F) of the Tribal Constitution, Compensation of the Tribal			
24	Council is hereby established. Tribal Councilors shall be compensated as follows:			
25				
26	1. Tribal Council Officers shall be compensated an annual salary of \$55,000.00.			
27				
28	2. Non-Officer Tribal Councilors shall be compensated an annual salary of			
29	\$50,000.00 .			
30				
31	B. Additional to the annual salary established in this Statute, Tribal Councilors shall receive			
32	the following:			
33				
34	1. Contributions to the Tribe's retirement plan or a similar plan shall be allowed			
35	with the same conditions and restrictions applied to Tribal employees and other			
36	contributors in the Tribal Government Retirement plan.			

1 2 3	C. The co	ompensation of the Tribal Council shall be subject to federal and state taxation
4	where applica	ble. Tax withholdings are elective and may be withheld from each payment.

6 7	D. Comp	ensation shall be paid weekly in equal increments.

9	SECTION V	. TRAVEL EXPENSE

11	Travel expens	ses for approved travel may be paid in advance or reimbursed at the same rate as
12	allowed emplo	oyees in the Tribal Council approved Tribal Governmental Employees Travel
13	Reimburseme	ent Policy, or as amended.

16	SECTION V	I. STIPENDS
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18		d Officers and Tribal Councilors shall not be paid a stipend for participation in any
19	activity or eve	ent.

24	A. Persor	as receiving compensation authorized by this Statute shall be prohibited from:

26	1.	Receiving pay for two (2) or more positions. Councilors shall only receive pay as
27		a Tribal Council Officer or a Non-Officer Tribal Councilor; additional pay is not
28		allowed even when a Tribal Councilor assumes an additional position or
29		additional responsibilities.

31	2.	Receiving unemployment compensation for any reductions or termination of
32		compensation established by this Statute.
33		
34	3.	Receiving any other type of payment for compensation not explicitly listed in this
35		Statute, including stipends.
36		

1	4. Receiving overtime.

3	5. Receiving any pro-rata amount of compensation for missed meetings due to		
4	incarceration from a sentencing of a crime.		
5			
6			
7	SECTION VIII. EMPLOYMENT		
8			
9	In accordance with Article XV (A)(3) of the Tribal Constitution, Tribal Councilors may work in		
10	Tribal enterprises but must abstain from discussions and voting on matters involving that		
11	enterprise. If employed in Tribal enterprises, the Tribal Councilor may not hold more than one		
12	fulltime paid position in the Tribes enterprises, even if they decline pay for one of the positions.		
13			
14			
15	SECTION IX. SEVERABILITY		
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17	If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, phrase or portion of this Statute is, for any		
18	reason, held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall		
19	be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the		
20	validity of the remaining portions thereof.		
21

23	SECTION X. EFFECTIVE DATE		
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25	Effective upon signature of the Executive or thirty (30) days from Tribal Council approval		
26	whichever comes first or if the Executive vetoes the legislation, then upon Tribal Council		
27	override of the veto, but shall not be implemented until after the next election and until the next		
28	Tribal Council or individual councilors are sworn in.
