

OEAHC BOARD OF DIRECTORS OPENINGS

The Odawa Economic Affairs Holding Corporation (OEAHC) is seeking applicants who are interested in serving the OEAHC Board of Directors. There are currently four vacant seats on the Board. Two of the open seats *must* be filled by LTBB Tribal Citizens. All four vacant seats' term length is three years and has the option to reapply at the end of the term.

What we do: The Board has sole responsibility for managing OEAHC and designated nongaming enterprises and tribally charter corporations. The purpose of the corporation is to act as a general-purpose holding company that establishes uniformity and economic opportunities among the designated Tribally Chartered Corporations and LLCs by providing audit services, reporting requirements, meeting policy and procedures, negotiating fire and utility services, insurance coverages, and other administrative services. Currently, OEAHC is active in Property Management and Commercial Construction. OEAHC leases land to Lume Cannabis Co. in three locations, directly manages a Professional Office building, and shares ownership of Aki Construction with two other Michigan Tribes. OEAHC's goal is to continue to grow the current assets and to diversify the corporation's economic portfolio to bring back value to the Tribe. OEAHC is a for-profit organization.

- Business, Accounting, Finance, Planning, or Administration
- Possess leadership qualities and show good judgment
- Team focused and able to work collaboratively with various business partners
