2	accord	ance with the LTBB Constitution, Tribal jurisdiction over Tribal children in need
3	of care	is exclusive within the exterior boundaries of the Reservation. Therefore, the
4	Tribal	Court shall accept transfer of all such cases that may have arisen in state court.

26	jurisdi	ction or	ver all cases and exclusive jurisdiction over Tribal children. The Court shall not
27	defer t	o the ju	risdiction of another Court unless it transfers jurisdiction under Section VII.

29		2.	Tribal Child found or residing outside of the Tribe's territorial jurisdiction. The
30			shall accept transfer of any case involving a Tribal child who resides outside of the
31			rial jurisdiction but within the boundaries of the Reservation described in Article
32	III.H c	of the T	ribe's Constitution. The Tribal Court may accept transfer of any case involving a
33	Tribal	child re	esiding outside of the Reservation based on the following criteria:

12	jurisdiction over a non-Indian child, the Court shall provide notice to the State of Michigan of the
13	pending LTBB Court proceeding.
