3	TRIBAL GOVERNMENT BUDGET STATUTE
4	
5	SECTION I. PURPOSE AND SHORT TITLE
6	
7	The purpose of this statute, which may be cited as the "Budget Act," is to mandate a process
8	and deadlines for the government of the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians to
9	follow in the formulation and implementation of its annual budget. This statute repeals and
10	replaces Waganakising Odawak Statute 2020-006.
11	
12	SECTION II. DEFINITIONS
13	
14	A. "Chief Financial Officer" or "CFO" means the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa
15	Indians' Chief Financial Officer.
16	
17	<b>B.</b> "Cost Recovery Fund" means the fund consisting of monies from Fringe Benefits,
18	Maintenance, Indirect Costs and other restricted revenues.
19	
20	C. "Fiscal Year" means the time period from January 1 to December 31.
21	
22	<b>D.</b> "Fringe Benefits" means the non-wage expenses for the benefit of employees.
23	
24	<b>E.</b> "Fund" means a segregated, self-balancing account, <i>i.e.</i> Grant/Federal Contract
25	Funds, Cost Recovery Fund and General Funds, used to record revenues, expenditures,
26	assets, liabilities and other financial transactions for a specific purpose, activity or objective.
27	
28	<b>F.</b> "General Fund" means the fund consisting of monies from current year anticipated
29	revenue, the General Fund Balance and any funds that have been restricted as Supplemental
30	Funding, but are unspent.
31	
32	G. "General Fund Balance" means the fund consisting of monies from prior years'
33	unrestricted general fund dollars that were budgeted but not expended in the year they were
34	budgeted and that are returned to the general fund unrestricted balance available for
35	appropriation in subsequent years.

**I.** "Governmental Branches" means the Legislative, Executive and Judiciary branches of LTBB and, for purposes of this statute, the Tribe's Election Board and Prosecutor.

- **J.** "Grant/Federal Contract Fund" means the fund consisting of monies from recurring or anticipated revenue that is received by the Tribe from sources including, but not limited to,
- 10 Indian Health Services, IHS; Bureau of Indian Affairs, BIA 638; and Native American
- Housing Assistance and Self Determination Act, NAHASDA.

**K.** "Indirect Costs" means the expenses that are incurred in joint usage of internally servicing a governmental program and are not directly assigned or identified with a direct program or function.

**L.** "Indirect Cost Rate" means the formula used by United States Department of the
18 Interior that pools all of the indirect costs on an annual basis through an allocable, approved
19 plan.

21 M. "LTBB" or "Tribe" means the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians.

N. "Maintenance or Space Costs" means the costs of all the government office building upkeep, allocated on a square foot basis. Costs include the wages and fringe of maintenance staff, cleaning and maintenance supplies and equipment, repairs made for regular upkeep, snow removal and lawn care, and utilities, including telephone and internet service.

**O.** "Operating Budget Modifications" means the transfer of monies between line-items within an individual fund within the same fiscal year.

**P.** "Tribal-Wide Budget Worksheet" means the worksheet listing governmental 32 departments and individual programs that is attached to the Resolution approving the budget 33 for a given fiscal year

#### SECTION XI. APPROVAL PROCESS

11 **A.** Tribal Council shall approve the Annual Budget by the annual meeting.

- 13 **B.** The Annual Budget shall be approved by Tribal Resolution and shall include an
- 14 attached detailed worksheet of the Tribal-Wide Budget.

15

- 16 C. The approved Annual Budget shall be available for Tribal Citizens at the Annual
- 17 Meeting in accordance with the Constitution.

18

- 19 **D.** The Annual Budget shall be deemed enacted if not expressly vetoed by the Tribal
- 20 Chair within thirty (30) days of submission.

21

- 22 **E.** If the Chair vetoes the budget, then he or she must submit an Executive proposed
- 23 signed Tribal Resolution and new proposed budget along with the veto to Tribal Council
- 24 within the thirty (30) day time period allowed for the veto.

25

F. The Chair's veto and proposed budget must be made available to Tribal Citizens and posted to the Tribe's website.

28

- 29 **G.** Tribal Council may enact a budget by either overriding the veto by an affirmative
- 30 vote of seven (7) Councilors or alternatively enact the Chair's submitted signed Tribal
- 31 Resolution with the proposed budget by an affirmative majority vote of Tribal Council. In
- 32 enacting the Chair's proposed budget, Tribal Council shall approve it as presented and shall
- 33 not make any changes, additions or deletions to the proposed budget.

35 **H.** If the veto is not overridden within the time period as set forth in the Administrative

7	A. Upo	n approval of the budget, Tribal Council may allocate and restrict funds from the
8	General Fu	nd Balance and any funds that have been restricted as Supplemental Funding, but
9	are unspent	from the prior year.
10		
11	<b>B.</b> To a	illocate and restrict funds under this Section, Tribal Council must enact a
12	Resolution	specifying how the funds may be used, e.g. Supplemental Funding, Economic
13	Developme	nt, Investment, Sinking Fund, or other specific use.
14		
15	C. Fun	ds restricted under this Section shall only be used for the specific use identified in
16	the authoriz	ing Resolution.
17		
18		
19	SECTION	XIII. SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING PROCESS
20		
21	A. Sup	plemental funding shall be appropriated by Resolution from the monies that have
22	been design	ated and restricted for Supplemental Funding.
23		
24	<b>B.</b> A re	quest for supplemental funding shall include the following information:
25		
26	1.	The reason for the requested supplemental funding:
27		a. Emergency,
28		<b>b.</b> Specific additional service or program or
29		c. Budget deficiency;
30		
31	2.	A brief narrative;
32		
33	3.	The amount requested;
34		
35	4.	Required signatures; and

2	<b>5.</b> Proposed funding source.
3	
4	C. All requests must be received in accordance with Tribal Council Policy. Such
5	policies shall include dates and deadlines for submissions, posting requirements and the
6	approval process.
7	
8	<b>D.</b> Special Tribal Council meetings may be called for emergency funding requests.
9	
10	<b>E.</b> Any monies not expended during the fiscal year shall revert to General Fund Balance
11	funds.
12	
13 14	SECTION XIV. BUDGET MODIFICATIONS
15	SECTION AIV. BUDGET MODIFICATIONS
16	<b>A.</b> No monies can be moved between two different revenue sources. Revenue sources
17	are General Funds, Cost Recovery, and Grant/Federal Contract Funds.
18	are General I ands, cost Recovery, and Grand's ederal contract I ands.
19	<b>B.</b> Within a fiscal year, no more than 4% of the total amount of either budget can be
20	moved between two different departments or individual program not within a specific
21	department as listed on the approved Tribal-Wide Budget Worksheet, without Tribal Council
22	approval. Such requests shall be posted for comment on the Tribal website for at least seven
23	(7) days prior to Tribal Council approval. Tribal Council shall act on the request within
24	thirty (30) days of receipt of the request.
25	
26	C. Operating Budget Modifications are allowable so long as the CFO ensures that all
27	space costs are adequately funded prior to approving any budget modification involving
28	space costs.
29	
30	<b>D.</b> All budget modifications must be reviewed by the CFO to ensure that no material
31	change in an existing service or program is altered either in nature or scope. If there is a
32	material change in an existing service or program by either a change in the nature or scope of
33	the service or program, then the budget modification shall be submitted to Tribal Council for
34	approval.

2	SECTION XV. ADDITIONAL REVENUES
3	
4	<b>A.</b> If actual revenues during a fiscal period exceed the projected revenues, the CFO, on a
5	quarterly basis, will report to Tribal Council the amount of excess funds, the date of the
6	receipt of the funds and the funding source.
7	
8	<b>B.</b> If actual revenues during a fiscal period fall short of projected revenues, Tribal
9	Council shall take necessary actions to ensure that funding for approved budgets is available
10	by adding additional sources of revenue to the budget or shall declare a budget emergency.
11	
12	
13	SECTION XVI. EMERGENCY BUDGETS/RECISSIONS
14	
15	<b>A.</b> At any time during the fiscal year, the Office of Finance and Revenue, based on a
16	revenue analysis and other relevant factors, may recommend to Tribal Council to declare a
17	budget emergency.
18	
19	<b>B.</b> If Tribal Council declares a budget emergency, Tribal Council shall provide guidance
20	and criteria for amended budgets that must be submitted by the Governmental Branches
21	within the timeframe provided by Tribal Council. All amended budgets must be passed by
22	Tribal Resolution.
23	
24	C. Upon the declaration of a budget emergency by Tribal Council, Tribal Council shall
25	take necessary steps to notify Tribal Citizens of the impact of the budget emergency.
26	
27	SECTION XVII. SYSTEMATIC REDUCTIONS OF BUDGETS
28	
29	Only through an approved Resolution may any systematic cuts to budgets occur.
30	
31	
32	SECTION XVIII. CHECK SIGNERS
33	
34	The Tribal Chair shall have the authority to designate check signers and file the appropriate
35	authorized forms to carry out this function.

3	SECTION XIX. SAVINGS CLAUSE
4	
5	In the event that any phrase, provision, part, paragraph, subsection or section of this statute is
6	found by a court of competent jurisdiction to violate the Constitution, laws or ordinances of
7	the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians, such phrase, provision, part, paragraph,
8	subsection or section shall be considered to stand alone and to be deleted from this statute,
9	the entirety of the balance of the statute to remain in full and binding force and effect.
10	
11	
12	SECTION XX. EFFECTIVE DATE
13	
14	Effective upon signature of the Executive or 30 days from Tribal Council approval,
15	whichever comes first, or if the Executive vetoes the legislation, then upon Tribal Council
16	override of the veto.
