#### WAGANAKISING ODAWAK STATUE #2024 -1 **EXCLUSION** 2 3 4 5 SECTION I. **PURPOSE** 6 7 The Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians hereby declares that the power to exclude is an inherent and essential part of Tribal sovereignty, and indispensable to the Tribe's autonomy and 8 self-governance. Further, it is a natural right of the Citizens of this Tribe, through their Tribal 9 leaders to exercise the power of exclusion to protect and safeguard their natural, economic and 10 cultural resources, and to protect the health, safety and welfare of Tribal citizens. 11 12 13 SECTION II. **AUTHORITY** 14 15 This statute is enacted pursuant to Article VII, Section D.5 of the Constitution of the Little 16 Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians, which recognizes the Tribe's inherent right to exclude 17 persons and other parties from Tribal lands. 18 19 20 SECTION III. **DEFINITIONS** 21 22 23 For purposes of this statute: 24 "Exclusion" means a formal limitation or prohibition on a person's or entity's 25 presence and activities on Tribal lands. 26 27 В. "Indian" means any person who qualifies as an "Indian" under 25 U.S.C. § 1301. 28 29 C. "LTBB," "Tribe" or "Tribal" means the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians. 30 31 D. "Non-Citizen" means any person who is not a Citizen of the Little Traverse Bay Bands 32 of Odawa Indians and any entity that is not at least majority-owned by the Tribe. 33 34 E. "Respondent" means the Non-Citizen that is the subject of Exclusion Proceedings. 35 36 37 F. - **3.** The factual basis for the request; and
- **4.** The signature of the Petitioner.

**C. Scheduling**. Upon receipt of a petition for exclusion, the Legislative Office shall schedule a time for Tribal Council to consider the petition at the next regularly scheduled Tribal Council meeting or, if urgent and authorized, at a special or emergency session.

**D. Petition Review.** Tribal Council must consider the petition in open session unless a reason for closed session exists under the Open Meetings Statute. Tribal Council may solicit input from or invite the participation of any person having information pertinent to the petition.

**E. Decision Timeframe.** Unless at least five (5) Tribal Councilors vote to extend the consideration period, a petition for exclusion shall be deemed denied if an exclusion order is not issued within thirty (30) calendar days of the date of the meeting in which it is considered.

#### SECTION VII. EXCLUSION ORDERS

**A. Exclusion Determination.** Tribal Council may, by the affirmative vote of seven (7) members of Tribal Council, order the exclusion of a Respondent. An Exclusion Order shall contain:

- 1. The Respondent's name;
- **2.** The grounds for exclusion;
- 3. The term of the Respondent's exclusion; and
- 4. Any additional information Tribal Council deems appropriate.

**B.** Executive Review. Tribal Council shall provide the Tribal Chairperson with notice and a copy of its Exclusion Order on the same day in which a vote authorizing such order is taken. Within three (3) business days, the Tribal Chairperson (or their designee if the Tribal Chairperson is unavailable) shall notify Tribal Council that they concur, concur with conditions and/or recommendations, or dissent.

**C. Final Decision.** Tribal Council may, by the affirmative vote of seven (7) members of Tribal Council, amend or withdraw its proposed Exclusion Order in response to the Tribal Chairperson's feedback.

**D. Notice to Excluded Party.** Tribal Council shall provide an excluded Respondent with a copy of its final decision by First Class mail with a courtesy copy via email. If the Respondent's address and email address are unknown, Tribal Council may provide notice by any alternative means that is reasonably likely to reach the Respondent.

- E. Judicial Review. A Respondent shall have the right to appeal an Exclusion Order in
  Tribal Court only; however, the Tribal Court's jurisdiction shall be strictly limited to ensuring
  that the Exclusion Order does not violate Respondent's federally protected rights. If the Tribal
  Court determines that such a violation exists, it may modify the Exclusion Order as necessary to
  comply with federal law. The Tribe expressly reserves its sovereign immunity and shall not be
  liable for claims of loss, damage or injury resulting from exclusions.
  - **F. Modification of Exclusion Orders.** Tribal Council may, by the affirmative vote of seven (7) members of Tribal Council, amend or withdraw any existing Exclusion Order.

#### SECTION VIII. ENFORCEMENT OF EXCLUSION ORDERS

- **A. Non-Citizen Indians.** Any non-Citizen Indian present on Tribal lands in violation of an exclusion order shall be guilty of criminal trespass and subject to immediate arrest by Tribal law enforcement officers.
- **B.** Non-Citizen, Non-Indians. Any non-Indian, non-Citizen present on Tribal lands in violation of an exclusion order shall be immediately removed from Tribal land by Tribal law enforcement officers. In addition, such non-Citizen shall be fined up to treble the maximum amount allowed under LTBB's criminal laws if the non-Citizen were an Indian convicted of criminal trespass.

## SECTION X. EXCLUSION REGISTRY

Tribal Court shall maintain and publish on its website a registry of all non-Citizens who have been excluded under this statute. For each excluded non-Citizen, the registry shall contain:

**A.** The non-Citizen's name.

- **B.** A recent photograph of the non-Citizen.
- 33 C. The basis for the non-Citizen's exclusion.
- **D.** The date of the exclusion order.
- **E.** The termination date, if any, of the exclusion.
- The Tribal Court may remove the non-Citizen from the registry upon receipt of proof of death or formal dissolution of an entity.
