TRIBAL RESOLUTION # 071624- 01

Authorize and Approve Supplemental Funding in the amount of three million and 00/100 Dollars (\$3,000,000.00) for the purpose of financing and operating a 50-unit workforce/affordable residential housing development in Petoskey, Michigan to come from the General Fund-Fund Balance

- WHEREAS, the Waganakising Odawak Nation, known as the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians, and its citizens are vested with inherent sovereignty and rights of self-governance; and
- WHEREAS, the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians is a federally recognized Indian Tribe under Public Law 103-324, and is a party to numerous Treaties with the United States, the most recent of which are the Treaty of Washington of March 28, 1836 (7 Stat. 491) and the Treaty of Detroit of 1855 (11 Stat. 621); and
- WHEREAS, the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians is governed by a Tribal Constitution adopted by the citizens of the Tribe on February 1, 2005; and
- WHEREAS, Tribal Council authorizes and appropriates budgets through Tribal Resolutions; and
- WHEREAS, Tribal Council desires to make a loan to Odawa Economic Development Management, Inc. to help finance the development of a 50-unit workforce/affordable residential housing development on property located in Petoskey, Michigan (the "Project").

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians Tribal Council repeals Tribal Resolution 071124-01: Authorize and Approve Supplemental Funding in the amount of three million and 00/100 Dollars (\$3,000,000.00) for the purpose of financing and operating a 50-unit workforce/affordable residential housing development in Petoskey, Michigan to come from the General Fund-Fund Balance.

FURTHER, BE IT RESOLVED that the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians

Tribal Council authorizes and approves Supplemental Funding in the amount of three million and 00/100 Dollars (\$3,000,000.00) to come from the General Fund – Fund Balance with the understanding that Odawa Economic Development Management, Inc. will repay the funds to the Tribe via a credit bid transaction exchanging LIHTC building for the debt at the end of the project period and authorize the Tribal Council Legislative Leader to sign related documents on behalf of the Tribe.

FINALLY, BE IT RESOLVED that in accordance with the Constitution, the Executive Branch shall administer such funds as appropriated by Tribal Council.
