7	This Statute establishes the procedures to make laws in accordance with the Little Traverse Bay						
8	Bands of Odawa Indians Constitution. This Statute repeals and replaces Waganakising Odawak						
9	Statute 2018-007 and any previous Statute, Resolution Regulation or Policy language with regard						
10	to the same.

SECTION III.

3	<b>A.</b> A Tribal Council member sponsoring a proposed statute may, on their own initiative or				
4	on behalf of a Tribal Citizen, request it to be placed on a Tribal Council meeting the agenda				
5	for consideration of a motion to post to the Tribal website.				
6					
7	<b>B.</b> A Tribal Citizen may propose a Statute or an amendment to an existing Statute. Tribal				
8	Council will have sixty (60) days to consider whether or not to post the proposed Statute to				
9	the LTBB website.				
10	C. After sixty (60) days, any Tribal Council member may choose to sponsor the proposed				
11	Statute. The sponsoring Tribal Council member(s) and Tribal Citizen(s) names shall be				
12 13 14	included with the posting on the LTBB website.				
15	<b>D.</b> Following a successful motion, the proposed statute shall be posted to the LTBB				
16	website for a minimum of twenty-five (25) business days for public comment.				
17					
18	E. After considering any written or verbal statements submitted by Tribal Citizens during				
19	the 25-day public comment period, Tribal Council may entertain a motion to pass the				
20	proposed statute. If any substantive changes are made to the proposed statute following the				
21	public comment period, the revised version must be posted on the Tribal website for at least				
22	ten (10) additional business days and additional public comments considered by Tribal				
23	Council before a motion to pass the revised version is entertained.				
24					
25	F. Passage of a proposed statute shall require a majority vote of the Tribal Councilors				
26	present at the meeting in which a vote is taken.				
27					
28	G. Statutes shall automatically be removed from posting on the LTBB website, if any of				
29 30	the following occur:				
31	1. Not passed by Tribal Council after three-hundred and sixty-five (365) days				
32	of posting on the website.				
33					
34	Not approved by Tribal Council after being placed on a Tribal Council agenda and the				

motion for passage either fails or the motion fails for lack of support.

GENERAL LAWMAKING PROCESS

1	SECTION IV.	EMERGENCY LAWMAKING			
2					
3	In the event that imme	diate legislative action is necessary to preserve or promote the rights or			
4	resources of the Tribe or its Citizens, a statute may be passed at the same meeting that it is				
5	introduced, or at a spe	cial meeting called for that purpose. An emergency statute shall require a			
6	unanimous vote of all Tribal Council members present at such meeting where no more than two				
7	sitting Tribal Council members are absent.				
8

10	SECTION V.	CERTIFICATION AND NUMBERING			
11					
12	<b>A.</b> Proof of passag	ge of a Tribal statute shall be by written certification signed by both the			
13	Tribal Legislative Le	ader and the Tribal Secretary. The certification shall state at a minimum			
14	the date of passage, the	hat a quorum of the Council was present, and a roll call record of the vote.			
15					
16	<b>B.</b> All enacted sta	tutes shall be titled "Waganakising Odawak Statute" followed by a seven			
17	(7) digit number. The first four (4) digits will be the year of the enactment. The last three (3)				
18	digits will specify the chronological order in which statutes are enacted in a given year,				
19	separated by a hyphen. For example, the first statute passed in 2024 will be Waganakising				
20	Odawak Statute 2024-001.

23	SECTION VI.	SUBMISSION TO EXECUTIVE			
24					
25	<b>A.</b> Upon passage	and written certification of any statute by the Tribal Council, the Tribal			
26	Council Secretary or designee shall send the certified original to the Executive for signature.				
27	Statutes shall be enacted into law upon approval by signature of the Executive, or if not				
28	expressly vetoed by th	e Executive within thirty (30) days of submission to the Executive.			
29					
30	<b>B.</b> If the Executiv	e approves the statute, then the Executive shall indicate such by either a			
31	dated signature or a dated stamp mark on the certified original document. If the Executive				
32	vetoes the statute, then the Executive shall indicate such by either a dated signature or a dated				
33	stamp mark on the cer	tified original document.

Tribal Council shall only vote one time to override the veto. If the vote for the veto 17 override fails, then the veto stands. 18 19 INITIATIVE AND REFERENDUM 20 **SECTION VII.** 21 22 The process for initiative and referendum is set out in Article XIV of the LTBB Constitution. 23 24 25 **SECTION VIII. COMPILATION** 26 27 All enacted statutes of the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians shall be listed A. 28 in chronological order on the LTBB website and shall also be available in chronological order 29 at the Legislative office. 30 31 В. One original signed copy of the enacted statute shall be kept in the Legislative office 32 and one original signed copy shall be kept in the Executive office. 33 34 C. The Legislative Services Attorney shall oversee the codification and maintenance of 35 the Tribe's current laws on the LTBB website. The Code shall be organized in a user-friendly 36 manner.

6	reason, held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall			
7	be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the			
8	validity of the remaining portions thereof.

11	SECTION X. EFFECTIVE DATE

13	Effective upon signature of the Executive or thirty (30) days from Tribal Council approval,			
14	whichever comes first, or if the Executive vetoes the Statute, then upon Tribal Council override			
15	of the veto.
